The Emerald Isle. Before you've travelled far in this country you'll be enchanted and captivated by the land, its people and its wonderful laid-back atmosphere. Enjoy touring around the south and west of the country, all in a relaxed manner.

Along the south and west coasts is where Blarney, The Ring of Kerry, The Dingle Peninsular and The Cliffs of Moher are all found. We include these as we travel leisurely along much of the Wild Atlantic Way route as far north as Westport.

It's then time to be in Dublin, to take in the history and culture of Ireland's capital city. You'll be fascinated by the colourfulness of the city, which is home to Molly Malone, Guinness and Trinity College containing the Book of Kells.

This tour offers wonderful travel in your own motorhome, in lovely locations and at a relaxed pace throughout, whilst enjoying Irish hospitality, hearty food and local drinks.

19 Nights

Day One – Wednesday 2nd September

We meet at a campsite near to Holyhead. Late afternoon the Tour Directors will host a welcome get together, a chance to meet your fellow travelling companions.

Day Two – Thursday 3rd September

We take the morning ferry from Holyhead to Dublin. The crossing is around 3.5 hours, where we sail in comfort in the ships club lounge. Upon arriving in Ireland, we travel to our first Ireland campsite in the charming city of Kilkenny. **5 miles, ferry, 80 miles**

Day Three – Friday 4th September

This morning we're collected by the 'little train' from the campsite and transported into the city where there will be free time to explore, including meeting up for a city centre group lunch. Later make your own way back to the campsite, taking the pleasant riverside walk of around 40 minutes or by making use of a taxi (payable locally).

Day Four – Saturday 5th September

We travel south today, to Blarney for a 2 night stop. **100 miles**

Day Five - Sunday 6th September

Today we visit Blarney Castle and for those who would like to, kiss the Blarney Stone. We take a walk into town, alternatively a taxi (payable locally) is available, where we have entry to the castle included. After our castle visit, lunch is at a traditional Irish pub in the centre of the village, followed by time to see Blarney and make our own way back to the campsite.

Day Six - Monday 7th September

A short drive today brings us to beautiful Killarney, the main tourist town on the Ring of Kerry. We stay at a well-appointed campsite for 4 nights. This evening we have a group dinner in the campsite's own hotel restaurant. **50 miles**

Day Seven - Tuesday 8th September

Today has been left free for an opportunity to explore Killarney centre and some of its many parks.

Day Eight – Wednesday 9th September

A full day coach tour today around the Ring of Kerry, including time at the Muckross Estate. Relax and take in the scenery as someone else does the driving, followed by time to explore the Muckross estate and gardens. Lunch included today.

Day Nine – Thursday 10th September

Free day. Maybe take a jaunting car (pony and trap) ride through the Gap of Dunloe.



Day Ten - Friday 11th September

We leave Killarney and travel to Doolin. For this journey we recommend taking the scenic route, which includes a local ferry across the Shannon estuary and picks up the Wild Atlantic Way. **110 miles**

Day Eleven – Saturday 12th September

Late morning we have a group boat trip along the Cliffs of Moher followed by early evening dinner in the village. Doolin is reputed to be the heart of traditional music, maybe this evening there will be an opportunity to catch some in a local pub.



Day Twelve – Sunday 13th September

A free day. For those who would like to independently visit the Aran Islands, boats depart from outside our campsite. Alternatively, just take it easy around the well-appointed campsite.

Day Thirteen – Monday 14th September

Continue along the scenic Wild Atlantic Way to the colourful university city of Galway. **50 miles**

Day Fourteen – Tuesday 15th September

Being located on the coast, Galway has a picturesque setting. The city has a vibrant feel and is well worth a visit. Walk or cycle along the promenade from our campsite to the centre or take the regular bus from close to the campsite.

Day Fifteen – Wednesday 16th September

Keeping to the scenic Wild Atlantic Way, we continue north as far as Westport and our campsite is located in the 400 acre estate of Westport House. **80 miles**

Day Sixteen – Thursday 17th September

This morning take a walk through the Westport Estate, the grounds of Westport House, which is an Irish national treasure dating back to the 1500's (house currently closed for visits as undergoing renovation).

Day Seventeen – Friday 18th September

We travel to Dublin for a stay of 3 nights, allowing time to see Irelands capital. Our campsite is situated on the edge of the city, within the grounds of the Camac Valley Park. **160 miles**

Day Eighteen – Saturday 19th September

Today we go into Dublin for a group guided tour of the city with a light lunch included.



Day Nineteen – Sunday 20th September

A free day. An opportunity to independently return to Dublin centre, the bus runs from outside our campsite, or you may relax around the campsite/Camac Park area, in preparation for this evening. Tonight we have our Farewell Dinner at a local Dublin venue, including live music traditional to the country.

Day Twenty – Monday 21st September

A relaxed start to the day after last night, later we make our way to Dublin port for our afternoon return ferry to Holyhead, again with club lounge entry included. Our tour comes to an end upon arrival back in Holyhead.
